

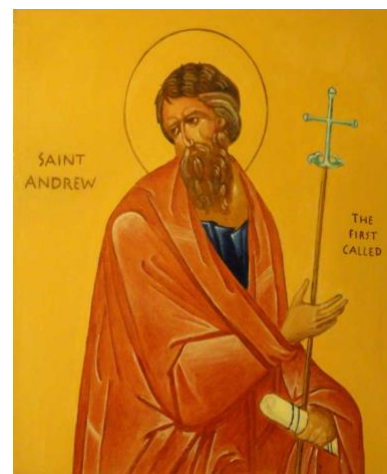

TAKE ACTION THIS WEEK:

- **Lent Compline began Wednesday, March 9th**
Please join this simple service of prayer and reflection to bring the day to a close on Wednesdays during Lent (April 6) at 7 p.m. on Zoom. Find the link on the St. Andrew's webpage. *In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and confidence shall be your strength. Isaiah 30.*
- **BOOK STUDY:** Our current book study is **Lent and Easter Wisdom** by Thomas Merton. Each day will contain a writing by Merton, a passage from scripture, a prayer, and a Lenten practice -- two pages per day. We began the readings on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. We will Zoom on Monday evenings from March 7 through April 25. Each Monday we will Zoom from 7:00-8:15 pm.
- **A Prayer for Peace from Presiding Bishop Michael Curry**
We pray for peace, but maybe we don't have the words. We pray for a just peace, but maybe we don't have the words. We pray that the lives of innocents and the lives of any human child of God will be spared. We pray that our leaders will find a diplomatic way, a nonviolent way of solution. But we don't know how to pray as we are. So, we pray that the Spirit intercedes for us at this time. Amen.
- **Offering our support to Ukraine**
There are many ways to offer support to the people of Ukraine, including our prayers. Organizations such as Church World Services, which sponsors the Crop Walk, (cwsglobal.org), and Episcopal Relief and Development (episcopalrelief.org) are excellent resources for donations.

HOLY WEEK AT ST. ANDREW'S

April 10 – Palm Sunday

We begin Holy Week by remembering Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, and end our worship with a solemn reading of the Passion of Jesus Christ
9:00 am – All God's Children Worship Service
10:15 am – The Liturgy of the Palms, Holy Eucharist, and Reading of the Passion

April 13 – Wednesday in Holy Week

The word Tenebrae means 'darkness'. We begin the service in light and, as we extinguish candles, we end in darkness to remind us of Christ's suffering and death.
7:00 pm – Service of Tenebrae on Zoom (see below)

April 14 – Maundy Thursday

We gather to remember the night before Jesus' death, as he washed the feet of his disciples and gave them the 'mandate' (from which the word 'maundy' comes) to love one another. The service concludes with preparation for the prayer vigil in which all are invited to watch and wait with Jesus.
7:00 pm – Family-friendly worship with Foot Washing, Holy Eucharist Rite II, Stripping of the Altar, and Prayer Vigil

April 15 – Good Friday

A service of solemn prayer, reflection, and the reading of the Passion of Jesus Christ.
7:00 pm – Good Friday Service

April 17 – Easter Day

10:15 am – Family-friendly worship with Resurrecting the Alleluias, Flowering the Cross, and Holy Eucharist Rite II
